Whether this is your first time at Camp or your 49th, we are excited you are here!

The focus of this camporee is patrol competition, with an emphasis on the Wild West. Each patrol will have a scorecard to complete. In addition to the scored events, we are arranging some extracurricular activities that will not count toward the patrol competition but will undoubtedly add to the experience.

- As always, the guiding rules for the Camp are the Scout Oath, Law, and the Outdoor Code.
- Everyone in Camp needs to register via Tentaroo: <https://forms.tentaroo.com/view.php?id=11010927>.
  - Due to the new national policy, ALL adults camping overnight with a Troop must be fee-paying adults registered with the BSA.
- **Campsites**
  - On your packet envelope, each unit is assigned a campsite.
  - Please be friendly and share the site with your fellow Scouts; this is an excellent opportunity for fellowship and especially for patch trading :)
- **Water**
  - water is in your campsites
- **Food**
  - Each Troop will be responsible for providing and cooking their meals.
  - Trash is to be placed in the dumpster or hauled out.
- **Fires**
  - Fires must be maintained in the burn barrels or designated pits; ground fires are **NOT** permitted.
  - Use only downed wood, and do not cut trees.
  - Fuels are not to be used in fire building.
  - Firem'n Chit guidelines are to be followed.

- **Trading Post**
  - Will be open Friday 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm,
  - Saturday 10:00 am – 5:00 pm and 7:00 – 9:00 pm
- **Regulations & Guidelines**
  - All units should bring a copy of and abide by the Guide to Safe Scouting
  - All Units are responsible for having their participant's medical forms with them.
  - Open-toe footwear is **not** permitted
  - Off-Limits Areas
    - Shooting Sports Ranges – Other than those, let through the gates with permission.
    - Water (no swimming or boating)
    - Areas outside Designated Camporee Areas
  - Buddy System
    - Scouts should always travel with a buddy.
    - If that buddy is an adult, there must be two deep leaders to maintain Youth Protection.
  - Vehicles
    - All Vehicles will remain in the Parking lot.
    - Troop Trailers will be allowed in Tenting areas with one vehicle.
    - No Vehicles will be allowed inside the gates.
- **Health and Health Officer**
  - The Health Officer is in the Medical Tent and will always be either staffed or available by radio.
  - Injuries and health issues should be reported to the health officer.
- **Emergencies**
  - In a Camp emergency, the camp alarm will sound.
  - Leaders must take attendance by name, see each attendee's face (adults, too), and send a runner to the Trading Post to report if all are accounted for or if something is wrong.
